



#### **How to Prevent a Fainting Episode!**

"I had fainted unless I had believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living". (Psalm 27:13) This statement of the 27<sup>th</sup> Psalm is spoken by David, David, the shep-

herd boy, David, the son of Jesse, David the slayer of the giant Goliath and David the target of King Saul's jealousy and yes, David, the king of Israel. If anyone would have had a reason to faint it certainly could have been David because each one of these roles carried its own set of challenges for David. As a shepherd boy David had to fight off the lions and bears that would stalk the flock, after slaying Goliath and winning the hearts of the people, David had to fight off the fits of rage that the jealousy of King Saul brought on and as King, David had to fight off external enemies and enemies from within his own household. You could say that David was in a "fight mode" that could have easily ended in a "fainting episode". As the children of God, we too are often bombarding by the attacks of the enemy which can leave us feeling as if we are in a boxing ring. This warfare can make us faint and tempted to throw in the towel. David was there, but did not go down because of the truth that we see in this text. II Timothy 3:16, 17 states that "All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works" This text profits us in that it gives us 3 ways to "prevent a fainting epi-

David said, "I had fainted unless I had believed to see ......there must be an:

Activation of your faith. Every believer according to Romans 12:3 has been given "the measure of faith" but we cannot not allow this faith to remain dormant. We must activate it by acting on what we know to be true and then adding to it. Romans 10:17 says that "Faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the word of God". So, if your faith tank is low, get more of God's word. Stock up on that word that applies specifically to your challenge and do whatever the word directs you to do!

He goes on to say, "I had fainted unless I had believed to see "the

goodness of the Lord"...there must also be an:

Expectation of favor. The long and short of this point is that God wants to be good to his children. Luke 12:32 states, "Fear not, little children; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom". God does not take pleasure in seeing His children faint, but rather takes pleasure in seeing His children blessed. There are so many scriptures that assure us that God is on our side and wants us to seek Him rather than throw in the towel. One that really brings this truth to the light is Romans 8:32 which says: "He that spared not His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?"

And finally David says: "I had fainted unless I had believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living".

Re-calibration of your focus. If we keep our focus too far in the future we will miss out on the pleasures, opportunities and purpose of our lives presently. We know that God has some great things in store for us when we get to heaven, in the "sweet bye and bye" but God wants us to enjoy what He has for us in the "sweet now and now". And not just when we get to heaven, but we can be too focused on tomorrow, next week and next month until just the anticipation causes us stress that really wears us out and causes us to become faint. When we are tempted to look off, way off in the future only to wonder about what might happen, what will I do if, and

I wonder if, let us remember what the psalmist said in Psalm 118:24, "This is the day which the Lord hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it". Recalibrate your focus, pull it in and see won't you find strength to carry on!

# November 2019 SUNDAY SCHOOL UNIT II WHAT'S IN STORE THIS QUARTERLY

The study this quarter focuses on God's gift of faith and how we respond to it both personally and communally. The sessions from the Old and New Testaments illuminate how God's grace impacts the lives of all believers, as demonstrated by their obedience, gratitude, and holy living. This quarter explores ways of honoring God through worship. The Old Testament sessions recall how David and Solomon honored God by establishing the center of worship in Jerusalem and building the temple. The New Testament sessions focus on Jesus' teachings about right attitudes that honor God through worship.

#### UNIT II, "FAITH LEADS TO HOLY LIVING"

Unit II, "Faith Leads to Holy Living," has four sessions that examine letters to early churches that tell them how to live as faithful followers of Christ. Second Corinthians tells the people to examine themselves to see if they are living in faith. First Thessalonians urges Christians to be positive examples of faith. First and Second Peter teach that faith requires holy living and goodness.


